NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING

To be held by the Toronto and East York Community Council (Under the <u>Planning Act</u>)

Request to Amend the Zoning By-law Application No. 11 190645 STE 28 OZ

Applicant: Concert Properties Ltd.

Location of Application: 40 SCOTT STREET and 10 WELLINGTON STREET EAST

DATE: Tuesday, February 14, 2012
TIME: 10:00 a.m. or as soon as possible thereafter
PLACE: Committee Room 1, 2nd Floor, City Hall, 100 Queen Street West

PROPOSAL

The application to amend the Zoning By-law proposes a mixed use building to a maximum of 58-storeys generally comprised of a 5-storey podium and 53-storey tower. The proposed building would be a maximum of 206 metres tall including the mechanical penthouse. It contains approximately 472 residential units, 5,642 square metres of commercial office space and 850 square metres of ground floor retail space. The proposal includes 343 car parking spaces in 5 levels of underground parking. The applicant is proposing to demolish the existing 7-storey structure and preserve and reuse its stone cladding for the new podium. The applicant has advised it is their intent to develop this project as a condominium.

Zoning By-law Amendments Appeal: If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City Clerk, attention: Rosalind Dyers, City of Toronto Administrator, Toronto and East York Community Council, at the address set out in this notice or by Fax: 416-397-0111 before the proposed Zoning By-law Amendment is passed or refused, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision to the Ontario Municipal Board and may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Municipal Board unless, in the opinion of the Board, there are reasonable grounds to do so.

People writing or making presentations at the public meeting: The City of Toronto Act, 2006, the

Planning Act, and the City of Toronto Municipal Code authorize the City of Toronto to collect any personal information in your communication or presentation to City Council or its committees.
